## **Resumes of the guests from the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sports**

RAN sponsormeeting Friday 13th of October 2017

Joost Clerx works at the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sports and is a member of the Management Team of the Health Insurance Department. Joost holds a Master's degree on economics from Tilburg University and worked for the Ministry of Finance from 2006 until 2016.

Sandra Looren de Jong works as a policymaker at the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sports. She holds a Master Health Economics of the institute for Health Policy and Management (iBMG). She focuses on the improvement of the Risk Equalization Model and contracting of home care by health insurers.

Daniëlle Willemse works as a policymaker at the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sport. She focuses on health insurance issues, like risk selection, consumers' switching behavior, and out-of-pocket payments. From 2011-2015, she worked at the institute of Health Policy and Management (iBMG) on her PhD research on regulated competition among health insurers.

Silvia Koerhuis works as a policymaker at the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sport. Her main focus is to further improve the Risk Equalization model of the Dutch Health Insurance System. In 2015 she finished her thesis on the effects of practice variation on the Dutch Risk Equalization model.

Christine Beerepoot holds a Master of Laws of the University of Amsterdam. Currently she works as Senior Legal Advisor to the Health Insurance Department at the Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sport in the Netherlands on health care entitlements, financing, free movement of capital, solvency, state aid and legislation. From 2011 until 2014 she worked at the World Health Organization, Regional office for Europe as a Senior Advisor in the Division of Health Systems, focusing on comparison of Health Systems and Health Services Delivery. As an author in the field of Health Systems she has published a wide range of books on curative and long term care.

Mieke Reuser is an economist and holds a PhD in Demography on modeling healthy life expectancy. She worked on Risk Adjustment modeling for a Dutch Health Insurance company. Since 2015 she works at the Dutch Ministry of Health, Welfare and Sports, focusing on Risk Adjustment and financing of health care.
